

SNU Expands Its Alumni Connection

The SNU University Advancement team has just unveiled new online software for the alumni section of the SNU website. (http://community.snu.edu/alumni).

Southern Nazarene University alumni can now go online to add or update personal contact information. They can decide whether or not their data is to be shared. They can register for upcoming events with an online shopping cart style format, make donations or elect to receive *Direction* magazine, SNU's quarterly alumni publication

This has been made possible through the purchase of software from Blackbaud NetCommunity. That Charleston, S.C. company is one of the leading fundraising software providers for nonprofits. They are perhaps best known for their Rasier's Edge software. This new software program will enable complete visibility into and control of SNU's alumni marketing efforts.

Todd Brant, Executive Director of University Advancement, says "SNU is incredibly dependent on maintaining a quality relationship with its alumni, both from a giving and from an event participation standpoint. This new software allows us to establish new connectivity information and maintain it long term. It will dramatically upgrade the way that we have operated in years past."

Two years ago, I began a digitization project embracing all recorded media held by the Fred Floyd Archives. Each record album, audio reel and video would have to be transferred in real-time and monitored by the operator. This meant listening to hours upon hours of music. As a former music major, I thoroughly enjoyed the work!

Digitizing the collection has been made possible by a generous donation from Dulan Elder, Class of '75. His interest in preserving the legacy of Collegiate Quartets provided the necessary equipment to transfer the entire audio collection. The Collegiate Quartet Collection debuted online at the *Wesleyan Holiness Digital Library* last year (www.whdl.org/).

Recently, I transferred a collection of Christmas music. After finding dusty albums and audio reels, I began listening to several unique recordings including *Handel's Messiah* which was formerly an annual community tradition; You can hear excerpts at the December ASP luncheon. After each item is transferred, the original is placed in acid-free, temperature controlled storage. The digital copies have been placed online at www.whdl.org/

Without the donation of Mr. Elder, I would not have been able to preserve these recordings through digitization. Digitization plays a huge part in the preservation of archival material for future generations, since the physical copies of the material will not last forever, regardless of the best archival storage.

I am thankful for my role in helping fulfill the dream of Dr. Paul Gray to create a space where our SNU history and heritage would be preserved and appreciated. It is my hope that these recordings will evoke pleasant memories and help us reflect on Christ's love and faithfulness throughout our history, and especially during this holiday season.

MAURINE DICKERSON

Maurine Dickerson was born on July 2, 1921, and passed away on October 18, 2016. Maurine graduated from Bethany-Peniel College (now SNU) and received a MA degree in English from Oklahoma State University, a MLS degree in Library Science from the



University of Oklahoma and an Honorary Doctor of Letters Degree from Mid-America Nazarene University.

She taught English in Mutual, OK, at Bethany Nazarene College, and at Mid-America Nazarene College. She also served as the director of the library at Mid-America. At her retirement in 1986, the Technical Services Department in the Mabee Library was named in her honor.

After retiring, Maurine served as a missionary at European Nazarene College in Switzerland/Germany for five years. She later volunteered in Nazarene Bible School libraries in Trinidad, Swaziland, England, and the Indian Bible College in Albuquerque, New Mexico. Maurine also set up a field library for the Regional Office in Lisbon, Portugal. She later helped to develop a library at the District Center of the Church of the Nazarene in Mandeville, Jamaica. She also taught English as a Second Language with the Educational and Cultural Interactions Institute in OKC.

From 1998 until it closed in 2014, Maurine faithfully served as librarian at Bethany First Church of the Nazarene where she was a member. She was also a member of the Association of Retired Ministers and Missionaries, the Academy of Senior Professionals, and three honor societies.

Maurine was preceded in death by her parents, Rev. and Mrs. L. H. Dickerson; her brothers, Artis and Darrell Dickerson, and her sister, Marjorie Shellenberger. She is survived by her brother-in-law Dr. Elmer Shellenberger; nephews, Dr. Kent Shellenberger and wife Stephanie, Ed Dickerson and wife Dixie, Milton Dickerson and wife Diane, and Don Dickerson; nieces, Rev. 
